Sunday Morning	Horning to Ludham Bridge	Ludham Bridge is a 15 minute run up from the mouth of the river Ant. Moor either side of the river once you have passed under the bridge. A small general store, craft shop, restaurant and The Dog Inn, are located within a 15 minute walk of the moorings.	4	1hr
Sunday Afternoon	Ludham Bridge to Sutton Staithe	You pass How Hill environmental study centre where you can walk nature trails, visit Toadhole Cottage or take the Electric Eel boat trip. Next is the picturesque village of Irstead before you enter Barton Broad. At the opposite end of the broad is <i>Sutton Staithe</i> .	6.5	1hr 30mins
Monday Morning	Sutton Staithe to Neatishead	There is space to turn your boat at the head of Sutton Staithe dyke, opposite the hotel. You will re-enter Barton Broad before turning towards <i>Neatishead</i> via a narrow dyke. Moorings are available at the end of the dyke.	3.5	45mins
Monday Afternoon	Neatishead to Acle	Retrace your steps down the narrow dyke and back through Barton Broad, Irstead and Ludham Bridge. <i>Acle</i> is situated on the River Bure and is spanned by a road bridge. Plentiful moorings are available either at the boatyards, a riverside shop or at the Bridge Inn.	12	2hrs 45mins
Tuesday Morning	Acle to Yarmouth	You will need to consult your tide tables to ensure you are travelling at the <i>correct state of the tide</i> so as to arrive at <i>Great Yarmouth</i> around low or slack water. The moorings at Yarmouth Yacht Station (not just for yachts!) are well sign-posted and are manned by rangers who will help you moor and tie up for the day or overnight.	11	2hrs 15mins
Tuesday Afternoon	At Great Yarmouth	Spend the day beside the sea, peruse the shops or visit the Tide and Time, Yesterday's World, Elizabethan House or Norfolk Nelson museums. The choice is yours for the rest of the day.	Nil	Nil
Wednesday Morning	Yarmouth to Stokesby	Consult the tide tables to ensure you are travelling at the <i>correct state of tide</i> . Though you are travelling back up the River Bure, you may need to pass under the low bridges and turn around on Brevdon Water if the current is too	9	2hrs

Wednesday Afternoon	Stokesby to Potter Heigham	You pass under the road bridge at Acle and see the narrow dyke on your left which leads to the village of Upton before turning right up the river Thurne. The white windmill at Thurne is first in view, standing at the mouth of Thurne Dyke. The entrance to Womack Water and the village of Ludham is a little further up the river on your left. Eventually you see the rows of chalets which line the river up to and beyond the low bridge at <i>Potter Heigham.</i>	8	2hrs
Thursday Morning	Potter Heigham to Ludham	A short cruise takes you back down the river Thurne to the entrance point on your right to Womack Water. A narrow dyke leads on to the Broad and it's moorings. It is a 15 minute walk to <i>Ludham</i> village.	2.5	45mins
Thursday Afternoon	Ludham to Ranworth	Re-enter the River Thurne and pass the White windmill at Thurne before turning right up the River Bure. You travel pass the entrance to South Walsham Dyke on your left and the entrance to the River Ant on your right before you see the tower of Ranworth church in the distance. Watch for the sign-post to <i>Ranworth</i> on your left then travel up the dyke to moor at the staithe.	6.5	1hr 30mins
Friday Morning	Ranworth to Coltishall	You pass the village of Horning before cruising through Wroxham towards the low road bridge. Moor at the Bridge Pilot staithe on the left hand side just before the bridge. The pilot will take you through the bridge and leave you at the other side where you continue your cruise to the village green at <i>Coltishall</i>	12	2hrs 45mins
Friday Afternoon	Coltishall to Wroxham	A short cruise back down the river Bure brings you back to Wroxham. Engage the pilot once more to take you through the bridge and moor at at one of the boatyards. <i>Wroxham</i> is a large village with plenty of shops and entertainments to keep the family happy.	4.5	1hr 15mins
